

# XFCE Wifi remains disabled

```
# rfkill unblock all
```

That makes sure it's not blocked.

Then the order of steps is important:

```
# systemctl stop NetworkManager.service
```

```
# nano /var/lib/NetworkManager/NetworkManager.state  
change from false to true on line "WirelessEnabled=true". Then:
```

```
# systemctl start NetworkManager.service
```

Then everything goes back to normal and wifi works. It seems network manager writes this state as false when it stops, but reads it when it starts, so a simple restart isn't enough.

In addition, I noticed that sometimes, despite these steps, I also needed to kill and restart nm-applet to get the options to not be grey.

```
$ pkill nm-applet  
$ nm-applet &  
$ disown
```
